Program Course Requirements

Students are required to take 7 must courses (3 of them non-credit) and 4 elective courses (each should be 3 credit). Requirements before starting to thesis

Before starting to thesis students are expected to complete all course requirements and pass the PhD proficiency exam.

PhD proficiency exam written form has three components:

- 1.** Comprehensive exam in developmental psychology
- 2.** Preparation of one undergraduate and one graduate course syllabus
- 3.** Preparing a research program in developmental psychology

PhD proficiency oral exam: Candidates are expected to defend their written exam.
