

# Social Psychology M.S. Program Application Requirements

Candidates who graduate from other fields can also apply to the social psychology master's program. If those candidates are admitted to the graduate program, they will be included in the scientific preparation program in which they take undergraduate courses, not exceeding 18 hours in total. The psychology courses previously taken by the candidates can be substituted for the courses to be taken in the scientific preparation program, depending on the decision of the application committee.

The number of applicants to be admitted into the program may change from year to year depending on departmental resources.

## Program Requirements

Students are required to complete one credit-based required course, six 3-credit elective courses, one additional 3-credit elective course, and the non-credit courses "Prosthesis Seminar in Social Psychology" and "Master's Thesis." Additionally, students must complete a master's thesis.
