

Social Psychology Ph.D. Program Application Requirements

Those who hold a Bachelor’s Degree in Psychology are eligible to apply to METU Social Psychology Ph.D. program regardless of their Master’s degree specialization. However, those who do not hold a Bachelor’s Degree in Psychology and wish to apply to METU Social Psychology Ph.D. program need to hold a Master’s Degree in Social Psychology.

The number of applicants to be admitted into the program may change from year to year depending on departmental resources.

Program Requirements

Students are required to successfully complete seven core courses (four credit courses and three non-credit courses) and four elective courses. PSY6002, PSY6099, and PSY9XXX are non-credit courses. All credit courses are worth three credits.
